Dear Parents/Carers,

We have started the last part of the year with glorious sunshine! I hope that you have all had a restful and enjoyable half term break. Many of the children have come back into school full of stories and recounts of play dates and activities with friends and family. We are very grateful for the gradual release of some COVID restrictions so that we have all been able to do a bit more, as the weather improves.

Within school, we are still bound by government COVID restrictions specifically for the school environment. At the moment, these are stricter than the restrictions outside school but we are hoping for some changes when the next step of the roadmap is announced in the next couple of weeks. We are also acutely aware that the number of cases of the Delta variant is increasing in neighbouring areas, so we need to remain cautious. Let us be hopeful for 21st June with further lifting of restrictions.

Irises of Hope – Diocese project

Our Irises of Hope focus week is well underway, with some classes creating fantastic artwork today. Fox class are even using paint and shaving foam for marbling on paper petals! We hope to be able to share some of your child's work from the project, in some form, over the coming weeks.

Reports

Class teachers have just started the long and important process of writing your child's report. These will be given to parents at the end of the academic year. Your child's report will contain information based on assessment against Age Related Expectations with special consideration given to the impact of COVID. More detailed information will be given alongside your child's report.

Class lists for September 2019

The class lists for September will be given out later this term. The class teachers begin meeting and thinking about the new classes towards the end of June. The lists then need to go through several checks and drafts before we pass this information onto parents. It is a very carefully considered process and we ask for your patience during this half term whilst we work on assembling the lists and arrangements for next year.

Sports Day

Unfortunately, due to COVID, we are unable to run a Sports day in the usual format this year. However, we will be holding a Sports Week for the children during the week beginning July 12th. This will involve each bubble taking part in a series of sporting activities on separate afternoons, so your child will still experience and enjoy a sports event. The scores from the Houses will still contribute to a final total and sports trophy for the week. It is unlikely, given the current restrictions, that we will be able to have parents and spectators on site, which is a great shame, but we will be closely watching to see if there are any changes to the school COVID restrictions. If the situation changes, we will contact you.

School Update from Miss Edwards and Governing Body

Our governor monitoring visits are in full flow, with a number of focused visits having already taken place this term with key staff members to gather evidence current performance and school improvements.

The visit schedule is agreed upon with the full governing body and visits are typically carried out by two governors and one member of staff. The feedback from the visits is then shared with the whole governing body and governors amalgamate the insights from these reports alongside school self-assessment and County visits to understand where progress is being made. The subject of these visits range from Health and Safety and Safeguarding to Reading, Writing and Maths with a particular focus on pupil provision for SEND and More Able pupils, as well as other key subject areas such as RE and Geography.
