Dear Parents,

#### **School Improvement**

During the summer, I will be reflecting on the progress we have made so far with our school improvement and preparing our next steps for the following academic year. I will share the main themes and key objectives in this plan in September. In the interests of improving our communication and exploring how parents and the school can work more effectively together, I will be seeking the views of parents during September.

## Staffing update

We were delighted that our three new teachers could join us yesterday and were able to meet their new classes. They have written the following messages:

My name is Mrs Elaine Basham. I am married with a two-year old daughter and live in Fleet. I have been teaching for 12 years. In this time, I have taught years 3 to 6, been English coordinator and Director of Studies. I am looking forward to working with your children in Fox Class and the whole of the Whitewater family.

## **Room change**

In September, Hedgehog and Otter Classes will be switching around and returning to their usual classrooms. Therefore, Otter Class will be located in the classroom next to Rabbit Class at the back of the school and Hedgehog Class will be in the classroom at the end of the building next to the playground. This will enable Otter class to access the outdoor learning space, in this area, with greater ease. This is particularly important for the year 1 children as they transition away from continuous provision.

Rabbit class will remain in the same classroom and Fox Class will increase in size with both classrooms (Fox and Red Kite classrooms) opening up into one space. This will enable greater flexibility with teaching for years 5 and 6.

### September

We are looking forward to seeing our children back in school, all together, from September. We are unsure what the covid recommendations for schools will be, but the current information states that schools will be operating to as near normal as possible, without the need for bubbles.

Therefore, our current plan is to return to our regular timetable in regard to school start and finish times. I am well aware, that for some of you, you have not experienced our normal opening hours so I have explained them below. This will also serve as a useful reminder for those of you who have experienced normal arrangements at Whitewater, before the pandemic.

#### Start Time

The green side gate will open at 8:40am. Children will then be able to go through independently and straight round into their classrooms, where they will be met by their class teacher. Adults remain at the front of the school. We recognise that for some children this change back may be a challenge, so the class teachers and I will support your children during the first weeks of school. We will help Year 1 children, in particular, as they have only experienced the numbered spots system as Reception children. The gate will close at 8:55pm. Please bring your child to the office if you arrive after this time. Your child will be recorded in the register as late if they arrive at the office after 9:00pm.

We will also return to our message book and letter bucket. If you have any messages, such as a change in collection for your child, forgotten school items or any welfare messages for the class teacher, please speak to me at the gate. I will record it in a book and ensure that this message is passed onto the relevant person.

#### Finish Time

School will finish at 3:30pm for all children. The green side gate will be opened at 3:25pm to allow the adults collecting children, to come onto the playground. The class teachers will bring the children out of the building and hand them over to you, once we checked who is collecting them. This is also a time when you can speak directly to the class teacher.

We will send a Parentmail communication in the week before your child starts back in September, reminding everyone of this information and outlining any changes.

## **Equipment for September**

Please ensure that your children are prepared for the first day back in September with everything they may need: correct school uniform, including suitable school shoes; book bags; PE kit and water bottles. All stationery the children need for learning will be provided by the school.
