Online Safety

With half term upon us I thought it relevant to share some handy tips for parents when it comes to children watching videos online. From animals doing funny things, to slime-making and game-tutorials, the internet has lots of fun videos for children to enjoy. But the amount and availability of content online means that children may see something inappropriate. To understand what type of content might not be suitable and advice on how to help your child watch safely, watch this short video guide.

The internet is a public and open space where anyone can post and share content. This can be fun and entertaining for children, but it does mean your child may see something that is intended for adults. Find out what to do if you're worried your child might see something inappropriate online or what to do if they already have.

Attendance

At the end of this half term, the school's overall attendance stood at 90.71% Please remember to fill in a leave of absence form, available from the office, if you need to take your child out of school for any reason. If the absence is unauthorised then, as set down by the department of Education, a Penalty Notice can be issued. In Hampshire, Penalty Notices are issued when a pupil has had 10 or more half-day sessions (equivalent to 5 school days) of unauthorised absence, in the last 10 school week period.
