YR in maths spent a lot of time outdoors engaging in exploring 6,7 and 8. The aim of the week was understanding that one number can be made up from two or more smaller numbers. Their spiders with 8 legs are now hanging down from the ceiling above our maths area! We also went down to the woodland walk area with our clipboards using our RSPB birdwatch numicon record sheets to observe the birds visiting our birdfeeders. In English we have been talking about the Queen's emotions when she lost her hat in the story. Rabbit Class came up with some amazing adjectives and recorded them. We all enjoyed joining in with James Carter during his fun filled poetry morning!

Otter Class have had an enjoyable couple of weeks. We found out that the Queen's hat had travelled all around London. We wrote diary entries as if we were the Queen, describing our favourite parts of the journey. Many of us chose to write about the last part, when the hat landed on a baby's head. In maths, we have explored the pattern between numbers and created number sentences. We have been adding and subtracting using number lines too. We have enjoyed exploring different materials like plastic and metal, especially as we also had fun stretching, bending and twisting play dough!

As part of Collective Worship, we have spent time talking about Martin Luther King. We have been impressed with Otter's compassion and their desire that everyone should be treated equally.

Our time with the poet James, was amazing! We all enjoyed the day. We wrote a class poem together called Cranky Creatures, which we performed to the school, and wrote our own Happy poems too. These will soon be displayed around school and in our classroom on our Otterly brilliant work display!

Over the past two weeks Hedgehog Class have been working hard and I am very proud of all of them. The children have produced some fantastic writing describing the city of Pompeii before and after the eruption of Mount Vesuvius. Their description included sentences like Mount Vesuvius roared like thunder and molten, ruby red lava exploded towards the heavens sending a shockwave through the world and changing it forever. The children have done some great work with their fractions unit in maths. They have begun learning about the Roman Empire, the invasion of Britain and designing and creating their own mosaics. Following the success of the poetry day, the children have dedicated the rest of the week on creating poems about impossible gifts.

Fox Class have spent the last week climbing out of the learning pit using protractors to measure angle accurately in maths. It's been a bumpy ride but great resilience has been shown by all. James ran workshops for all of the classes, sharing his experience of writing, and helping children develop their ideas further. The day ended with an opportunity for everyone to share part or all of their writing with the rest of the school and with James, along with a rendition of the banana song for Mr Golding. James was thrilled by the interest from children during the day who he described as responsive and creative. It was great to see the interest from the children in buying James' books after school.

Solar Panels

Many of you would have noticed the scaffolding around the school and the portaloo in the car park. As part of the Governments drive for obtaining cleaner energy, the Local Authority has been arranging for solar panels to be fitted to schools. We agreed to this project as it would have financial benefits as well as provide first-hand experience of sustainable energy sources for the children to learn about.

In initial talks with the contractors, we pointed out that they would need to undertake all relevant checks to see if they are allowed as we are in a conservation. After they conducted their checks, it was given the green light...until yesterday! It turns out that further findings now mean that we can no longer have the solar panels fitted. Although we won't be able to show the solar panels first hand to the children, we have been able to teach them about portaloos.
