Children enjoyed their woodland walk with clipboards and produced lots of writing despite the cold. They all enjoyed setting up their home corner as an igloo and built a play park for the penguins with slides out of guttering. Their imagination and interests are leading our planning. Our tuff trays are filled with ice and rice! Rabbit class started learning about Chinese New Year; it's the year of the Rabbit. So far, every time I ask them what year it is, they don't say 2023 - they shout 'Rabbit'. Phonics lessons are going so well, I almost want to teach two lessons a day! I would like to thank you all for your support at home and happy to announce that this week you will receive a home learning book with your first homework! - of course, it has to be Phonics.

There is a lovely buzz in the room and our visitors this week praised the way our children are learning and their

understanding of the learning behaviours. You must have seen the stickers; we have lots of slinky linky snakes, proud peacocks, independent iguanas and creative chameleons...

Otters have had a fantastic start to 2023! The class have immersed themselves in our new topic, 'Fiery Flames'. We have gone back in time to 1666 and learnt about 'The Great Fire of London' and what life was like at that time and how the fire started.

In English, 'Masha and the Firebird' has been the focus of our lessons with the children having the opportunity to create their own mythical creature! The class have shown amazing creativity with their creatures and at the same time, thought of some brilliant expanded noun phrases.

We have got messy with charcoal in our art lessons, experimenting with different pressures and strokes to create smoke effects in preparation for our art masterpiece based on the Great Fire of London.

In Science, the children absolutely loved creating their own habitat for pretend animals. The children designed and then created their habitat, thinking of what their animals would need in their environment to thrive.



Hedgehogs...

Welcome back to spring term and after a very icy week I am hoping for the weather to warm up soon. It has been brilliant to have your children back in school after the Christmas holidays and I am impressed with the way they have returned. The first week of term we were transported to a different time and place, the valley of the kings in ancient Egypt. During our topic lesson the children have asked questions about Egyptian artefacts and explained what they reveal about their way of life, they have looked at village life and how it differs from ours and learnt how the mummification process worked. They particularly loved the part about the brain being pulled out of the nostrils. In English, the children have been roaming reports detailing the exciting events of the 4th November 1922 and Howard Carters discovery of Tutankhamun's tomb. Their choice of language has been amazing and their knowledge has shown a great level of understanding. In art, the children have been studying the work of Christina Balit and her beautiful book the Scrabs Secret. Throughout our reading sessions the children have been



looking at new words in context, the way an author chooses their language for effect and how a lowly scarab beetle can save the life of a Pharoah. During the past 2 and half weeks we have fit in a lot of learning and I can't wait to share what our plans are over the next few weeks! Have a restful and enjoyable weekend. Mr Ralph.

Foxes...

Happy New Year to you all. In Fox Class, we have had a very busy start to the new year. We have begun the New Year with our topic of World War Two. The children have been very excited to start this topic. We have created timelines and considered the question 'What makes a good leader?' We started the term reading the book 'Once' by Morris Gleitzman. The children have worked hard learning about refugees and writing their speeches on homelessness this week. In Maths, we have begun learning about measurement, looking at converting units of measures and how to calculate perimeter and area of composite shapes. The children are looking forward to designing their clay sculpture in art. In science, they will be making their own parachutes to help them learn about factors that affect air resistance. The children are very much looking forward to testing them next week. In our next instalment from Fox Class, we will be back to hearing from the children themselves.
