

#### Foxes...

These last two weeks, Fox Class have been up to lots of exciting things. In Maths the Year 6 have been working on ratio while the Year 5s have been practising their place value skills. They have both been super resilient and worked hard. In English we have all been planning and writing survival guides based on our class novel 'Holes'. Fox Class have used model verbs in their writing to inform the reader that this step to survival is necessary.

Our topic in Art is Earth and Space. We have been working towards a collage of the galaxy using many different techniques like watercolour, chalk, pastels and marbling. Foxes have been looking at making a 2D circle into a 3D sphere using blending.

In RE we are looking at the Easter story and how Jesus died for our sins and the reincarnation of him. We are also looking at different interpretations of how Jesus looked. On Friday 17th of March, the school celebrated Red Nose Day, Foxes did many different activities related to Comic Relief including dressing up in red clothing to raise money for the children in need. The school has raised £373 in total. In PE we are doing dance with our topic being earth and space and we have been dancing to the theme tune to the original Star Trek.

On Monday 20th March, KS2 were privileged to meet an awesome explorer, James Ketchell. He talked to us all about some of his greatest adventures: rowing across the Atlantic Ocean, climbing mount Everest, cycling through many countries and many more. Foxes got an opportunity to talk to James and find out about what he had to do in his expeditions in a workshop. Everyone loved it and enjoyed getting some new things.

## Sponsored Reading Challenge and Red Nose Day...

Over the past few weeks, our values have shone through supporting two really worthwhile causes. Thank you to every child, parent and member of staff who have contributed both time and funds which will make a big difference to the lives of people we'll never meet. Our sponsored reading challenge raised an amazing £1660.60 for the Disasters Emergency Committee (DEC) who brings together 15 UK charities including the British Red Cross, to raise funds for Turkey and Syria who have been so badly affected by the recent earthquakes. In addition to this, a further £373 was donated for Comic Relief on Red Nose Day. For a school our size to raise over £2000 in a four-week period shows that Whitewater maybe small, but we're mighty! Thank you all for ensuring that we do more than just speak about our values, we act on them!

#### James Ketchell...

On Monday, we were treated to a very inspirational assembly. James Ketchell came in to speak to our Key Stage 2 pupils about his adventures across the world including climbing Mount Everest, rowing across the Atlantic Ocean, cycling around the world and becoming the first person to fly around the world in a gyro-copter. As well as sharing video footage and photos of his achievements, he also shared key learning experiences which link to our values he gained on the way:

- Respect the world is full of amazing people from different cultures and backgrounds
- Courage pursue your dreams and never giving up no matter how tired you feel

• Love – when someone does a favour for you - pass it on by helping someone else.

After the assembly, James spent time with Fox Class leading a workshop on specific elements of his experiences.



Throughout next week, we will be immersed in all things Easter. On Wednesday, children in Years 4, 5 and 6 will have the opportunity to take part in the 'Walk through Easter' which is delivered by Marion and her team held at Rotherwick Church.

The Easter Service on Thursday 30th March at 9.15am is for the whole school. All children will make the short walk up the hill to the church where we will be greeted by Marion. Parents and family members are invited to join us in celebration which will include some readings from the children in Fox Class and some joyful singing by everyone, all of which will be led by Marion.
