As always, I hope you enjoy hearing what has been happening across the school over the past few weeks.


#### In school...

#### Rabbits...

What a wonderful time of the year seeing the progress being made in so many areas of learning. I love watching Rabbits' increased independence and also their courage to persevere in all challenges set. We love our texts this term which inspire lots of writing. The Cook and the King was so popular that I had to plan lessons around it following children's interest and demand! Rabbit Class created story maps in groups with such excitement and then shared them with the whole class!

I wonder if you have noticed the difference in their handwriting, especially since we started focusing on kinetic letters. Thank you all for joining our Book Share Morning

every Thursday. We worked really hard with the children tidying our book corner to get it ready for this week.





With the warmer and brighter weather here, Otter Class have been enjoying athletics PE lessons and developing their skills in team activities. We have been thinking about 'achievement' in a broader sense too within our topic of 'Adventurers and Explorers' where we have been learning about a variety of famous people both from the past and present times. It has been interesting to learn about their achievements in addition to speaking about our own successes and reflecting on what makes us special.

In English we have enjoyed reading the book 'The Journey' and changing parts of it to make into our own stories. We will use the beautiful drawings in the book as a basis for our art masterpieces in the coming weeks, watch this space!



In DT, we designed and made boats, linking to Dame Ellen MacArthur and her solo voyage. The children were given a variety of materials to use and it was fascinating to see their finished boats! We tested the boats to see if they could float for a minimum of three seconds and much to everybody's relief, every single boat made floated!

#### Hedgehogs...

A busy couple of weeks in Hedgehog Class has been full of learning and fun. In Design and Technology, the children have begun planning their bridges to be tested in a few weeks' time. They began practicing sawing skills focusing on straight lines and above all - safety! Lucky the children went home with all ten digits intact. In Art the children have been

channelling their inner Van Gough and recreating Starry Night in

order to create their own version of 'Starry Night Over the Rhône' to link with our topic of rivers. During topic lessons, the children have begun their topic of Rivers beginning with the water cycle and different parts of a river. The children recreated the water cycle in scientific models with the use of warm water, plastic and ice packs to mimic evaporation, condensation, precipitation and finally collection. During reading sessions, the children are reading the book 'The Storm Whale' by Sarah Brennan focusing on beautiful and challenging vocabulary and emotive imagery. In English the children are well on the way to writing their stories based on the book 'Flood'. It has been a fantastic two weeks and I hope you all enjoy the coronation celebrations and school and at home. Enjoy the weekend and see you all Tuesday!



#### Foxes...

We've had a busy start to summer term in Fox Class. The children have very much enjoyed reading 'The Forbidden Forest' chapter from Harry Potter and using this for inspiration for writing their suspense stories – the children worked extremely hard to use skills which keep the reader on the edge of their seat. This week, we have begun the terrible tale of Macbeth. The children are looking forward to discovering how the story ends. The children have decorated their writing books with ghastly illustrations – fantastic!

In Maths, both Year 5 and Year 6 children have been working hard on increasing their accuracy and consistency in their arithmetic and learning about reading and interpreting different forms of graphs and charts. In Art, we have been very excited to begin learning about Frida Kahlo and the art movement 'surrealism'. The children have built confidence in drawing accurate portraits in the style of Frida Kahlo. Over the next few weeks, they will work on their self-portraits. Over the last week, the children have been working so hard on their auditions for the end of year production. Mrs Taylor and Mrs Elie were thoroughly impressed and had the very difficult task of allocating the roles. Full of excitement, the children now know their parts – we know everyone will be fabulous in the show. To celebrate the coronation, the children enjoyed a small party yesterday in class – we are all excited to celebrate on Saturday.

Last week, our children took part in the TCS Mini London Marathon! It was fantastic to get the whole school outside and active!
